Director Notes

The concept for Into The Woods came about because Stephen Sondheim wanted to write a "quest" musical, where the characters went on a journey to find something, like in The Wizard of Oz. And James Lapine had a desire to write a fairytale. From their collaboration came a musical that intertwines the plots of several fairytales, exploring the consequences of the characters' wishes and quests. "Wishes come true, but are not free." Into the Woods is a beautiful metaphor for life. It is about what happens after happily ever after. "It's about growing up and real life and understanding the differences between reality and fantasy." The story entreats us to see the forest through the trees, before it is too late.

Into the Woods opened at the Martin Beck Theatre, in New York, on November 5, 1987. In a year, dominated by Andrew Lloyd Weber's "The Phantom of the Opera," the production won the 1988 NY Drama Critics Circle Award and the Drama Desk Award for Best Musical, a Grammy Award for Best Original Cast Recording, and three Tony Awards for Best Musical Score, Best Book Musical and Best Actress in a Musical, Joanna Gleeson. Into the Woods quickly became a fan favorite, making it Sondheim's most popular musical.

It has been my pleasure to direct this amazing musical. I have loved fairytales since I was a child, and to direct this show is one of my dreams come true. I want to thank my cast, who have been working diligently on this show for four months. I applaud their commitment and talent. They have followed me, and my vision, and have done so with humor, love and dedication. I also want to thank my wonderful crew and orchestra. They bring all the details of the show, to life without all of the applause. And yet, without them, the show would not be possible. Thank you to everyone who has poured their blood, sweat and tears into the show, with me. It has been a long, but fulfilling journey. You are all amazing, and I am blessed to have worked with all of you. Thank you, thank you. Bravo!!!
